We will begin March by celebrating “Read Across America” and Dr. Suess’ birthday.

In our Wonders Program we will be focusing on the following skills:

Social/Emotional Learning: “asking questions”, “I can remember”, “confidence”, “think it through”, “feeling detectives”, and “different ideas”.

Phonics/Spelling/Handwriting: H, h, E, e, F, f, R, r, B, b, L, l, K, k

Phonological Awareness: rhyme, sound segmentation, blending, counting syllables

High Frequency Words: my, are, he, with, is, little, she, was

Genre: Informational text, Personal narrative, Realistic fiction, Fantasy, Poetry

Reading skills/strategies: key details, character, setting, events, ask/answer questions

In Religion class, we will be learning about and celebrating Lent as we will try to be more like Jesus. I will be reading stories about Jesus and his many miracles. We will also learn about St. Patrick, “The Patron Saint of Ireland”.

In Math, we will begin Chapter 6: Tables, Graphs and Fractions.

This month in Social Studies, we will practice our address and also learn about our neighboring towns on Cape Cod. In Science, we will be talking about Weather and Seasons. Please see the attached “Show and Tell”--“Winter, Spring, Summer, Fall, Guess my birthday one and all!” due on Wednesday, March 20th.

March Kindergarten Homework Challenge

2. Practice printing one row of each letter: H/h, E/e, F/f, R/r, B/b, L/l, K/k,

4. Cut and paste the days of the week in the correct order on the lined paper, then print the word between the lines.
5. Cut and paste the number words on the lined paper, then print the numbers between the lines.
6. Print 4 words that rhyme with: /can/
7. Print 4 words that rhyme with: /bed/
8. Print 4 words that rhyme with: /pig/
9. Print 4 words that rhyme with: /not/
10. Draw your house and print your address.
