Happy May Day! I can't believe how quickly the year has gone by. We still have about one and a half months to go with a lot of activities planned and some final testing to complete. We will begin Unit 8 in our Wonder's Reading Program, and will be covering the following:

Themes: One the move, My U.S.A., Look to the Sky

Social/Emotional Learning Skills: creativity—"thinking outside the box", social problem solving, focus/attention

Comprehension Strategies: making predictions, rereading for comprehension

Reading Skills: character, setting, plot, problem and solution, main idea and key details

Genres: realistic fiction, informational text, fantasy

Grammar: sentences with prepositions

Phonics/Spelling/Handwriting: Jj/Qq/Yy/Zz and r blends

High Frequency Words: here/me/this/what

In Math, we will complete the chapter on "Addition" and move on to "Subtraction". We will end our year learning about "Money, Time" and "Measurement", as we continue to review printing numbers, number order, adding and subtracting numbers, and the other math concepts we covered this year.

In Science, we will experience the life cycle of the Painted Lady Butterfly as it metamorphosizes from caterpillar to butterfly. We set up our "grass seed heads", and are ready to add water and watch the grass grow. We will learn about different types of maps in Social Studies.

In Religion, we will continue learning that "Jesus is our Friend" and talking about how we show our love for Jesus by caring for others, using kind words and actions, helping others, doing our best, and praying.
