Reading— The students have now been introduced to letters: a, m, and s. Additionally, this month they will learn the letters: p, t, and i. We learn to identify each letter and produce its sound. We are now beginning to blend some of these sounds together, using the short vowel: a. For example, Sam, map, sat, etc. This skill takes lots of practice and will take time to master. The more we practice the more confident we will become.

We have also been focusing on both listening and reading comprehension. We often discuss our predictions about a text prior to reading it and use picture clues to help us do this. While reading, we stop to look for clues that give us information. After reading or listening to a text the students will then draw or write about what they heard, including "key details".

Math- We just completed our second chapter and can now identify solid and plane figures. These shapes include: cube, cone, rectangular prism, sphere, cylinder, triangle, square, circle, rhombus, hexagon and trapezoid. We also explored the world of patterns. The students can now identify color, shape, size and growing patterns. We learned to identify the pattern rule before we completed each one. You can continue to reinforce these skills at home while building with blocks, playdoh and puzzles. Shapes and patterns are everywhere!

<u>Science-</u> Pumpkins, pumpkins, pumpkins! We spent the month of October exploring pumpkins. We even investigated our very own pumpkin after Mrs. Ryder carved it open. Inside we discovered seeds and even spent the time counting the seeds. We grouped the seeds into sets of ten and then we counted them, only to discover that we had just over four hundred seeds. Wow! We saved some seeds and hope to see some sprouts growing from them soon. We will begin our "Healthy Foods" unit later this month.

Religion— We have been continuing to practice our prayers. We have noticed that the students are becoming more confident each day as we pray. God is surely smiling every time He hears those prayers.

We celebrated All Saint's
Day together as a school community
in church. We were able to attend
mass with our 6th grade buddies,
making mass extra special. Fr.
John's homily helped to inspire
some discussion about becoming a
