NOTES FROM THE OFFICE February 10, 2021

As February vacation is beginning, I share with you this message from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education:

The Department recognizes that the upcoming February vacation may pose a challenge to districts in their efforts to limit students' and staff's exposure to COVID-19. The Department outlines reminders about the best practices that the Department of Public Health has outlined. These include:

limiting the size of any gathering, limiting get-togethers to only people who live together or to a small group of individuals with whom they are regularly in contact, and avoiding travel. Anyone considering travel should review and abide by Massachusetts <u>travel orders</u>, people who want to travel to another state that is not a <u>lower-risk state</u> should be aware of the quarantine requirements involved with such travel.

Families traveling, including weekend trips skiing, have been the source of increased problems for teachers and students, not only at SPXS, but at other schools as well this year. The absences caused by vacation-necessitated quarantine, draw teacher time and attention away from the students onsite, and have affected children's schooling experiences. Optional travel has had unexpected impacts on schools this year, and was never the impetus to offer remote learning. However, if you are traveling, follow the required guidelines to ensure the saftey of those at school.

We want everyone to enjoy vacation, and an ensure a safe return on Feb. 22nd!

For the 2021-2022 school year, I will pay my student's tuition by the payment option checked below. If not previously enrolled with FACTS through St. Pius X School, I will setup an automatic deduction online with FACTS. A FACTS account must be set up or tuition must be paid in full by May 28, 2021.

OPTION 1 Full Tuition Payment due by April 30, 2021 to receive discount. Cash, check, and credit cards (Visa, Mastercard, Am/Ex, Discover) accepted. A 3% service fee will be applied to all credit card transactions. A discount of \$50.00 per student is applicable if tuition is paid in full by April 30, 2021.

OPTION 2 Monthly Payments through FACTS. This option entitles the responsible party to budget
payments over 11 months beginning May 2021. Payments are made on the 5^{th} or 20^{th} . There is a \$50
administration fee processed by FACTS for use of this option.

If you are enrolling in FACTS for the first time through St. Pius X School, account setup instructions will be emailed to you.

2021-2022 Tuition Policy

Each family is required to sell 20 Christmas calendars. If a family decides not to participate in this fundraising opportunity, \$200 will be added to their overall tuition bill.

When a student registers at St. Pius X School, we not only hold a place for that student, but also commit resources to optimize the educational experience of that student. We design staffing, programs, and acquire supplies based on the number of registered students to ensure a quality education.

Each year we forgo potential income by limiting the number of incoming students, when we commit a place for your son or daughter. We also depend on full and timely payment of tuition. According to the policies of the Diocese of Fall River, all financial obligations to St. Pius X School must be met before a student may enroll in another diocesan school. St. Pius X School will notify the receiving school if these obligations have not been met.

A non-refundable tuition deposit of \$250 for each child is due with this commitment form. This deposit is credited towards tuition. Deposit monies received will not be refunded.

Once a student has begun a month, tuition for that month must be paid, in addition to what has already been paid.

I agree to make tuition payments for the 2021-2022 school year according to one of the options above. I have read the school policy regarding tuition and agree to abide by this policy.
