We are so excited to kick-off the **2019 Raffle Calendar Sale**! This is one of two major fundraisers sponsored by the Friends of SPXS and we need EVERY family to participate. **Our goal is to sell 4,200 this year!** 

The proceeds from this fundraiser go directly back to the school – BENEFITTING YOUR KIDS - by enabling the Friends of SPXS to supplement the school budget and provide in-school enrichment activities, field trips, educational enhancements, equipment, sports programs, and so much more!

Each family is expected to sell at least 20 Raffle Calendars at \$10 each from **October 12th** – **December 5th.** Purchasers will be entered into a daily drawing throughout the month of January. The daily cash prizes range from \$50 to \$300. People can win more than once!

There are also prizes for selling! We know how hard families work to sell these calendars and we want to reward you. Prizes (see the attached list) will be awarded to the families and the class selling the most calendars. Mrs. Dailey also has something SPECIAL planned IF we exceed the goal of selling of 4,200, and IF we have 100% family participation.

When selling raffle calendars, please remember to write your family name on the removable stubs, along with the name and phone number of the calendar purchasers. The purchasers will keep the calendar part of the ticket and you will turn in the stubs and all monies collected. Please return all stubs weekly so that we can keep track of the class and family rankings!

A leaderboard of the Top-Selling Families, the "20 and Up" Club, Class Rankings, and progress towards the school goal, will be posted at school and on the Friends of SPXS Facebook page. All raffle ticket stubs must be returned to the school by Thursday, December 5th to be counted for rankings.

If you would like more than 20 calendars, please send a note into school. We will give out more raffle calendars after previously-sold stubs have been returned, in increments of up to 50. If you are selling at a commercial location, you can have more than 50 at a time. **Only original raffle calendar stubs can be submitted - NO photo copies.**

### Christmas Raffle Calendars SELLING LOCATIONS!

Several businesses/churches have generously agreed to allow SPXS families to sell raffle calendars at their locations at specified times. For now, please do not sign up for more than two time slots so that we can make sure all school families have an opportunity to sell at one of these locations. If locations/slots do not fill up and when we add additional slots, we will notify everyone via the weekly school emails to families (aka "The Wednesday Envelopes").

When selling at these locations, please have your child(ren) dressed in the SPXS Full Dress Uniform. Every family is required to sell 20 calendars, which we know is EASY to do at a commercial location. If you would like more calendars to sell, please send in a request to the office and we will send them home in quantities of up to 50. Once those calendars have been turned in, we can release more.

Each family is responsible for bringing their own supplies. We suggest bringing change (e.g. \$10 bills), several pens, a clipboard or hard surface for writing, and other items to help make your sales easier (cash box/money pouch, card table, table cloth, decorations to attract a crowd, mints, etc). A little bit of effort can go a long way! And of course the cute kids REALLY help sales!

### KEEP HALLOWEEN FUN SAFE AND (SOMEWHAT) HEALTHY!

### ALL DRESSED UP:

- Make sure that shoes fit well and that costumes are short enough to prevent tripping, entanglement or contact with flame.
- Consider adding reflective tape or striping to costumes and trick-or-treat bags for greater visibility.
- Because masks can limit or block eyesight, consider non-toxic makeup a safer alternative. Hats should fit properly to prevent them from sliding over eyes..
- Look for costumes and accessories with labels clearly indicating they are flame resistant.
- Ensure swords, canes, or sticks make are not sharp or long.
- Review with children how to call 9-1-1 if they ever have an emergency or become lost.

### HOME SAFE HOME:

- To keep homes safe for visiting trick-or-treaters, parents should remove from the porch and front yard anything a child could trip over such as garden hoses, toys, bikes and lawn decorations.
- Parents should check outdoor lights and replace burned-out bulbs.
- Wet leaves or snow should be swept from sidewalks and steps.
- Restrain pets so they do not inadvertently jump on or bite a trick-or-treater.

### ON THE TRICK-OR-TREAT TRAIL:

- A parent or responsible adult should always accompany young children on their neighborhood rounds.
- Obtain flashlights with fresh batteries for all children and their escorts.

- If your older children are going alone, plan and review the route that is acceptable to you. Agree on a specific time when they should return home.
- Only go to homes with a porch light on and never enter a home or car for a treat.
- Remain on well-lit streets and use sidewalks when possible
- Only cross the street as a group in established crosswalks .Never cross between parked cars or out driveways.

### HEALTHY HALLOWEEN

- A good meal prior to parties and trick-or-treating will discourage filling up on Halloween treats.
- Consider purchasing non-food treats for those who visit your home, such as coloring books or pens and pencils.
- Wait until children are home to sort and check treats. Though tampering is rare, a responsible adult should closely examine all treats and throw away any spoiled, unwrapped or suspicious items.
- Try to ration treats for the days and weeks following Halloween.





### **Must Bring Photo ID & Insurance Cards**

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### PERSONS WHO SHOULD <u>NOT</u> BE VACCINATED:

- 1. Persons who have an allergy to eggs or egg products.
- 2. Persons who are ill and have a fever should delay vaccination until the fever and other temporary symptoms have gone.
- 3. Persons who were ever paralyzed by Guillain-Barré Syndrome.
- 4. Anyone who has had a past reaction to the flu vaccine.
