VOLUNTEERS AT SPXS AND COVID

We are thrilled to welcome back volunteers and visitors to SPXS this year, but want to be certain we continue to address health concerns while doing so!

Since COVID-19 became part of our daily lives, SPXS has done everything possible to ensure the health and safety of our students, our staff, and anyone who visits the school. The lens through which we have viewed COVID safety is to follow protocols to keep students, staff, and visitors from contracting COVID.

Last year any volunteers or visitors were unable to be onsite in the school. As Covid rates declined, and vaccinations became available for specific groups, the school continued to make decisions based on the best interest of SPXS students, staff, and community members. Visitors are allowed, but for the safety of all, *everyone* must currently wear a mask in the building.

At this time, we are also requiring that volunteers or visitors who will be directly interacting with the children or will be in a space that the children will be using that day, be vaccinated. The policy, which has been discussed with Fr. John, our pastor, is intended solely to protect the health of those in the school building.

Volunteers who will be working with a child, a group, or a class or those who would be in a gathering space students will use (e.g., at tables in the cafeteria) are informed they need to be vaccinated. We rely on the honor system, and do not currently ask for proof of vaccination. Parents and guardians are not restricted from the building for after-school events such as Curriculum Night or Parent-Teacher Conferences, as after these events we are able to sanitize the classrooms or building spaces.

Up to this week, most of our school students were ineligible for vaccinations. When the rate of vaccinations for those within the school rises to a point where our population is protected, we will re-evaluate the policy.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

This new policy regarding Physical Education classes will be added to the handbook:

Physical Education

MEDICAL EXCUSES

A note from a parent or guardian must be provided if a student is unable to participate in PE class. This is acceptable for 1 class.

If your child is unable to participate for more than 1 class, then a doctor's note is required.

It is assumed that if you are participating in out-of-school physical activity, then you are physically able to also participate in PE class.

When a student is medically excused, they will be expected to fill out a worksheet during class on the sidelines or given another task that will help the student earn credit for the day.

If your child has been out of PE class due to a long—term injury, a clearance note from a medical provider is required for your child to be allowed to participate again, unless otherwise specified at the onset of the injury.

This Thanksgiving donation is completely voluntary. If you choose to be a part of it, please donate the assigned item.



Dear School Families,

All schools in the Diocese of Fall River will be reporting confirmed positive COVID-19 cases to their school families on a *weekly basis*. Our school will provide this weekly summary to our school families on Wednesday each week via our usual Wednesday electronic communication.

Anne Paruti, Assistant United States Attorney

United States Attorney's Office-District of MA

Anne Paruti currently serves as the Chief of the Major Crimes Unit, where she oversees the work of AUSAs prosecuting a variety of federal crimes. She is also the district's Project Safe Childhood coordinator; in that role, she oversees child exploitation cases prosecuted throughout the district, is involved in collaboration with local District Attorney's Offices, and helps to develop and implement the district's PSC outreach program. Anne has been a prosecutor since 2007, first at the Middlesex District Attorney's Office, and then as a federal prosecutor at the U.S. Attorney's Office. She has focused her practice on child protection since 2012.

Eileen Moriarty, Assistant District Attorney

Cape & Islands District Attorney's Office

Eileen Connors Moriarty started her career at the Cape and Island's District Attorney's Office as an intern in 2003. In 2005 she became a full time Assistant District Attorney. Over the years Assistant District Attorney Moriarty has prosecuted cases in all of the Cape and Islands District Courts. She has been a Juvenile Court Prosecutor since 2010.

Katherine Kelley, Supervisory Senior Resident Agent

Federal Bureau of Investigation — Boston Field Division

Katherine Kelley currently serves as the head of the Lakeville Resident Agency of the FBI. The Lakeville Office falls under the FBI Boston and is responsible for all Federal crimes, to include al Crimes Against Children and Human Trafficking, in Southeastern Massachusetts to include Cape Cod and the Islands. SSRA Kelley has served as an FBI Agent for nearly twenty years and served in the Richmond Field Office, the New York Field Office, FBI Headquarters in Washington, DC and Boston, and has worked predominately criminal violations for the majority of her career. She also led the New York's Evidence Response Team, in which led to SSRA Kelley being deployed to over 17 countries to include Iraq and Afghanistan.

SRO Sergeant Bill Massey

Chatham Police Department

Sergeant Bill Massey started his career in L.E. in 1997 with the Town of Southampton. He joined the Chatham Police Department in 2005 and was promoted to Sergeant in 2010. He is currently assigned as School Resource Officer, serving Monomoy Middle School and Chatham Elementary School. He has been involved in school-based policing since 1999 and is certified as an SRO through the National Association of School Resource Officers. He is also an alumnus of the FBI's LEEDA (Law Enforcement Executive Development Association). Bill holds a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice.

SRO Dennis Stampfl

Barnstable Police Department

Patrol Officer Dennis Stampfl began his law enforcement career in 1997 and is currently assigned as a School Resource Officer for Barnstable High School. He is currently a member of the CCIT (Community Crisis Intervention Training) team which specializes in providing training for officers involving mental health and child development issues. He was the Adopt a School Officer for Barnstable Intermediate School for 7 years. He is an ALICE instructor for the school district and many other organizations. Officer Stampfl embraces his position as an SRO and is committed to the safety, equity and well being of all students and staff.

United States Attorney's Office-District of MA

Lauryn Myers is the Victim/Witness Specialist within the United States Attorney's Office who handles all crimes involving child exploitation throughout the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
