REQUEST FOR PARISH SUBSIDY

Parents who wish to enroll their child/children at St. Pius X School may request financial assistance from their parish. CHAPPED LIPS

TIPS FOR LIPS:

Protect your lips: Before going out in cold, dry weather, apply a lubricating lip cream or balm that contains sunscreen. Reapply often while outdoors.

Avoid pulling or biting dry skin: The skin on your lips is thin and delicate. Picking at it can cause it to bleed and hurt, slow the healing process, and cause more irritation.

Avoid licking your lips: Saliva evaporates quickly, leaving lips drier than before licking

Eat a balanced diet: Maintaining a healthy diet is important in taking care of your lips..

Stay hydrated: Drink plenty of water. Dehydration leads to chapped lips.

Use a humidifier to add moisture to the air: Humidifiers provide moisture in the air, which provides moisture for your lips and skin. Turn it on at night to replenish your skin while you sleep.

DRY/CHAPPED HANDS

PLANS FOR HANDS

Moisturize: Apply a quality moisturizing cream or lotion several times per day. Putting moisturizer on once a day is inadequate. Lotions and creams help restore moisture and seal it back into the skin.

Thicker Products for More Damaged Skin: Petroleum jelly is a reliable standby.

Or choose a thick, rich moisturizer in a formula that contains heavier ingredients such as dimethicone, cocoa or shea butter, or beeswax.

Wear gloves/mittens: protect hands from the elements with gloves or mittens

NOSE BLEEDS

KNOW YOUR NOSE

The inside of your nose has many tiny blood vessels. These blood vessels are easily irritated, which can often lead to nosebleeds. Winter's cold temperatures and dry air increase the likelihood of getting a nose bleed. However, you can take steps to reduce winter-related nosebleeds

Step 1: Blow your nose as gently as possible, using a soft tissue or cloth

Step 2: Use a humidifier in your home to introduce moisture into the air. Dry winter air can make the blood vessels more susceptible to damage.

Step 3: Apply petroleum jelly to the inside of nasal passages. This will lock in moisture.
