

Fear of failure among children in America today is at epidemic proportions. It causes them to give less than their best effort, not take risks, and, ultimately, never achieve complete success.

When your ego and identity are still forming, what might seem like small failures to others can cause heartbreak and self-blaming for children and especially teens..

However, the truth is that failure can offer much greater life lessons than success. But first, teens have to learn how to face failure head on.

Mistakes are the essence of new learning!

Failure connects children's actions with consequences which helps them gain ownership of their efforts. Failure teaches important life skills, such as commitment, patience, determination, decision making, and problem solving. It helps children respond positively to the frustration and disappointment that they will often experience as they pursue their goals. Failure teaches children humility and appreciation for the opportunities that they're given.



As students experience new things and develop new competencies it is inevitable that they will make mistakes. If mistakes and failure are seen as a sign of incompetence and something to avoid (rather than something to expect), our students will begin to avoid the challenges necessary for learning. Psychologist Janet Metcalf argues that students may actually benefit from making mistakes (and correcting them) rather than avoiding them at all costs.

How can we help kids to accept their errors and failures?

Adjust the learning context: "Let's try this another way."

Recognize the energy the student is expending and praise them for taking on a challenge. Help them see that the strategies they are using are ineffective and it's time to try something new.





Encourage persistence: "Keep trying. Don't give up!"
As adults, we have a lot of power to influence our students' efforts by sharing our own vulnerability and identifying our own self-conscious emotions, our stops and starts during problem solving, and our commitment to keep going.

Model self-compassion: "Be kind to yourself when you're confused; it's okay." If we model and normalize the ups and downs of learning with our students, we can also share the power of self-compassion.

Praise Effort Rather than Achievement: Instead of "You're so smart" try "It's great to see you working so hard/taking on a challenge"



Focus on resilience: "Even though this is tough, you will find your way."

When researchers reviewed over 38 studies of resilience in response to failure, errors, or mistakes, they found that more resilient individuals had higher self-esteem, lower levels of perfectionism, and a more positive way of explaining past events (e.g., I failed the test, but I can study harder next time). Try to avoid always rescuing. Allowing children to struggle helps them learn resilience.






